## **Travel by Train with Confidence**

On Sunday, 14th July 2019, I'll be travelling from Melksham to Weymouth for a day at the seaside, and I would be delighted for people to join me for the day. I can help you (if you've not used the train before) break your duck. I'm Graham Ellis, Vice Chair of the Melksham Rail User Group, co-ordinator of trips such as the Santa train. My profession (prior to current semi-retirement) was as an adult teacher / trainer - so I know a bit about trains and a bit about helping people with new experiences too.



**We'll gather at around 09:30 at Melksham Station.** Train leaves Melksham at a quarter to ten in the morning, and get to Weymouth about 2 hours later. We'll head back just after ten to six in the evening and be **back in Melksham just before eight in the evening.** There's a change of trains in both directions at Westbury, and I'll take care to make sure that all works well.

I'm posting this as general opening and asking people to get in touch if interested – I'm organising this personally, but with the backing of the Melksham Rail User Group. I'm very busy until 29th June when we're walking in the Melksham Carnival so will be shouting about this louder, and with a few more details, in the first days of July.

Cost? The train fare is normally £18.60 for each adult, £9.30 for children aged 5 to 15... but we can get together as a group and get a third off the adult fare. No reductions for children, I'm afraid. Please – at least one adult per group!
